Located in the town of Peterhead, is the 18th oldest 18 hole golf course in the world. Established in 1841, Peterhead Golf Course was extended to 18 holes in 1908 and today, the course is seen as a classic example of Scottish seaside golf at it's best and one of the toughest. Nearby in Cruden Bay is the championship course, an old-fashioned links golf course offering an internationally famous golfing experience. Last year, Cruden Bay Golf Course was placed at No 52 in the world by "Golf Magazine". Both courses are also loved for their magnificent beauty and panoramic views.

Other golfing gems dotted along the North-East includes Newburgh on Ythan, Fraserburgh, Alford, Royal Tarlair, TurriffAboyne and Huntly, all of which are a mixture of links and inland courses.

At the Palace Hotel, we are able to provide excellent packages for our guests. The package includes accommodation in one of our executive rooms at preferential rates which includes full Scottish breakfast and 3 course dinner. • TURRIFF GOLF COURSE

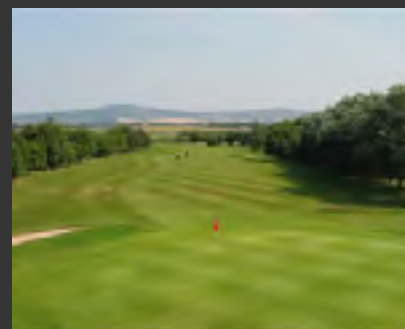
18 holes (Par 70), Inland 6,111 yards



Turriff is a well established parkland course, founded in 1896. The course has lush fairways, lined with mature trees, well-paced greens, and the added interest of water where the Turra burn and River Deveron cross and line fairways, making this a true test for golfers of all abilities. The par 5 12th hole sets a challenge for the longest driver while the short par 3, 4th hole, with a green protected by bunkers and out of bounds, is a challenge in its own right.

• ALFORD GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 69), Inland 5,483 yards



Situated in the centre of the village, this inland course is surrounded by the hills of Donside and Bennachie. Although it is relatively short course, do not be deceived. A round will demand all the skills one can muster making it challenging to golfers of all ages and ability without being too physically demanding. An ongoing programme of tree management enhances the parkland setting with the varied species creating an attractive environment for your enjoyment.

• NEWBURGH-ON-YTHAN GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 72), Links 6,162 yards



Founded in 1888, Newburgh-On-Ythan was originally a nine hole course laid out on the Newburgh Links which is located along the River Ythan estuary and the coastal dunes, producing spectacular scenery for all golfers. The course was then extended in 1996 and the new nine holes - the outward half - is characterised by undulations and hills, with elevated tees and greens requiring a range of shot making. The original inward nine demands accurate golf from tee to green and is the epitome of the typical Scottish links course. The course at Newburgh is noted for the quality of its greens, its playability regardless to the weather conditions and its magnificent setting.

STAYING AT THE PALACE

• SPEY BAY GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 70), Links 6,219 yards



One of the few remaining courses designed by the legendary Ben Sayers, Spey Bay, is a typical Moray Firth links course with its undulating and superb views to the Sunderland mountains. The course plays over rows of shingle banks formed naturally along the coast over centuries, creating exciting undulations on fairways which are lined with swathes of gorse and heather while shingle and the beach also form a border at some holes. Each hole at Spey Bay requires a good deal of thought from the tee and a deft touch around the greens, a challenge worthy of any keen golfer.

• HUNTLY GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 62), Links 4,456 yards



Huntly Golf Course is a rolling parkland course set between the rivers of Deveron and Bogie with a burn running across four holes. This, par 67 course rewards accuracy off the tee whilst not punishing too severely the less accurate player. There are a number of memorable holes that will no doubt make you plan a swift return. The newly refurbished clubhouse and the fully stocked pro-shop cater for everyone's needs with a friendly welcome before and after your round.

• CRAIBSTONE GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 69), Inland 5,613 yards



Craibstone Golf Centre is situated on the Craibstone Estate with wonderful views overlooking the city. This new and challenging course offers a fair and enjoyable test for all levels of golfers where one will be rewarded with accuracy off the tee, if you can achieve this and overcome the difficult 11th, 12th and 13th holes, you could score very well. The greens in these parts have a reputation for their excellent condition, and are both true and fast, and help to add to a memorable golfing experience that will have you coming back for more.

GOLF COURSES

• CRUDEN BAY GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 70), Links 6,396 yards



Cruden Bay Golf Course is very much placed high up amongst the elite and is regarded as one of Scotland's finest courses. Over a hundred years old, this traditional links course with Humps, hollows and greens tucked into unimaginable spots, golf at Cruden Bay is full of surprises. It demands its fair share of blind-shots. While some modernisation has occurred, the links stands largely as a reminder of bygone days and serves as a fine example to modern architects of what a course created primarily by nature should look like.

• INCHMARLO GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 71), Inland 6,218 yards



Laird's Course: The secluded setting for this dramatic 6,218-yard, par 71 course means the only sound you hear is often the lone cry of a buzzard soaring high above the course. Below, nestled in the foothills of the Grampians, the Laird's Course epitomizes golf in the North East of Scotland with tree-lined fairways, secluded greens and the ubiquitous Royal Deeside scenery combining to create a truly memorable playing experience.

• PETERHEAD GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 62), Links 4,456 yards



This natural links course, bounded by the River Ugie is the 18th oldest 18 hole golf club. It was established in 1841 and was extended to 18 holes from 9 holes in 1908 with a second 18 hole course 'The New Course' constructed in 1923. However today this course still exists as a 9 hole course. Peterhead Golf Course is a classic example of Scottish seaside golf at it's best where it's one of the toughest thus offering a testing challenge to any golf enthusiast!

• NEWMACHER GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 72), Links 6,659 yards



Opened in 1990, former Ryder Cup player and architect Dave Thomas designed this well shaped and prominent bunkered Championship Course. Acknowledged as one of the true tests of golf in Scotland, it is one of the toughest and most challenging courses in Aberdeen to all that sets foot on the first tee. Water hazards lines no fewer than 7 holes with ample foliage strategically placed around bunkered fairways and stately pines, birch trees and greens.

• FRASERBURGH GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 70), Links 6,308 yards



The 18 hole Corbie Course is a fine example of a traditional Scottish links course that is well protected by sand hills that fringe the length of Fraserburgh Bay. Its located 42 miles north of Aberdeen which exposes it to air from both Moray Firth and the North Sea so this particular course offers a stiff challenge to all levels of golfers when the wind blows from whatever source. Tricky par threes combined with some short but interesting par fours make Fraserburgh a delight to play. Fraserburgh is known as a friendly club and any visitor will thoroughly enjoy their trip.

• ABOYNE GOLF COURSE

18 holes (Par 71), Links 6,257 yards



Set amidst the scenic splendour of Royal Deeside, Aboyne Golf Club can fairly claim to have the finest vistas and panoramas of any course in Scotland. "A course of two halves" best describes the layout. The front nine is gently undulating parkland with generous tree lined fairways. The back nine is heathland and presents the golfer with a slightly more "muscular" challenge! Wildlife abounds round the course and if you're lucky you may just see an osprey fishing in the loch to the right of the 9th hole.
